#### CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Burlison made motion to approve consent agenda. Commissioner Hovater seconded the motion. The motion passed with all Commissioners voting aye.

1. Approved minutes of October 15, 2013 Commissioner meeting.
2. Approved payment of bills as presented.
3. Approved voting location change as proposed by Probate Judge Daniel Rosser. Precinct 4 Box 1 Cherokee Lion Den with 884 current voters and Precinct 4 Box 2 Cherokee Water/Gas Department with 428 current voters will be combined and all 1312 registered voters to vote at Precinct 4 Box 1 Cherokee Lion Den.
4. Approved payment of accumulated annual leave request by Minnie Smith in the amount of 2,869.20.
5. Approved 2014 Severe Weather Preparedness Tax Holiday for February 21-23, 2014.
6. Approved request for payment of 1,650.00 to Larry Black for Engineering services and 2,350.00 to Robert S. Stanfield for installation services. These services were provided for the Highway 247 onsite sewage disposal at the storm shelter.
7. Approved resolution for resurfacing County Line Road 48 from Poplar Creek Loop north 2.382 miles to AL157 as proposed by County Engineer John Bedford.
8. Approved ADECA grant for Drug Task Force for 63,172.92 for October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014.
9. Approved gas piping at Storm Shelter in the amount of 975.00.

#### PART TIME EMPLOYEES PAY INCREASE
