Colbert County Commission met today at the Colbert County Courthouse. Chairman Black called the meeting to order at 6:13 P.M. All Commissioners, except Commission Jimmar, were present at the meeting. Commissioner Hovater offered the invocation.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Gardiner made motion to approve consent agenda. Commissioner Creekmore seconded the motion and the motion passed with all Commissioners voting aye.

1. Approved minutes of January 5, 2016 regular Commission meeting.
2. Approved payment of bills as presented.
3. Approved purchase of ad for the Progress magazine presented by Heather McCarley, Account Executive at Times Daily. The cost of the ad is \$1,298.00 for one half page.
4. Approved nomination of Mr. Joel Mize to the Sheffield Port Authority Tuscumbia Landing. The appointment replaces Mr. George Carpenter, whose term ended December 2015.
5. Approved request by Probate Judge Daniel Rosser for payment of \$1,730.15 for services in certifying a voter's list to be used by the Absentee Clerk for the Presidential Preference Primary Election, March 1, 2016.
6. Approved sponsorship of TNT Productions/Marketing in the amount \$2,000 requested by Mr. Tim Turner. The event is in support of Tennessee Valley Multiple Sclerosis Support Group and will be held May 26, 2016 at North Alabama State Fairgrounds.
7. Approved resolution requested by County Engineer John Bedford to apply for and receive funding for the 2016 Vegetation Management Project, which includes vegetation management for the County Roads in the amount of \$63,960. County agrees to provide local match of \$12,792.00.
8. Approved one-day event liquor license requested by Alabama Wildlife Federation for a Wild Game Cook-Off scheduled for March 19, 2016 at

Longhorn R Arena, 2125 Three Mile Lane, Tuscumbia. This is a special event retail license and application was submitted to ABC Board.

County Engineer John Bedford announced promotion of Tracy Jackson to crew leader to replace Laurence Harrell, who retired at end of December, 2016.

County Attorney Edgar Black reported on previous request for help with improvements for Leighton Training School Community Service Organization. Mr. Black advised Commissioners against financial help, because the property is not owned by Colbert County and therefore funds cannot be used for improvements.
