Colbert County Commission met in regular session August 15, 2017 at the Colbert County Courthouse. Chairman Bendall called the meeting to order at 5:50 p.m. being the time and place previously scheduled for such regular session. Commissioners present were Commissioner Barnes, Commissioner Black, Commission Gardiner, Chairman Bendall, and Commissioner Hovater. Commissioner Jimmar was not present. Chairman Bendall declared a quorum was present and the meeting was convened and opened for the purpose of transaction of business. County Administrator Kathy Polk was also present and kept the minutes of the meeting. Commissioner Hovater offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING CDBG GRANT APPLICATION

Chairman Bendall announced that the Commission would hold a public hearing to consider the County's application for and use of Community Development Block Grant funds. Mr. Nathaniel White, NACOLG Community Development Specialist, presented a proposal with an application requesting grant funds for a waterline extension to Mt. Mills road. The estimated cost of the project is \$539,300.00. The CDBG funds requested is \$350,000.00 and the County match is \$189,300.00. The application for the project is due in Montgomery on August 31, 2017 at 12:00 noon. No other person wished to be heard on the application. Commissioner Hovater then introduced the following resolutions and moved for their adoption:
